14 year old Cecilia Cho (Pakuranga) collected her 15th title for the year when she won the Panasonic Auckland Womens Provincial Championship played at the Whitford Park Golf Club. She dominated the qualifying by firing sub par rounds of 66 and 65 (13 under) and then demolished all her rivals with the exception of defending champion Jane Lee (Titirangi) who took her to the 18th hole.

The following week Cecilia won the Under 19 National Championship, the Under 15 National Championship and collected the titles of National Secondary Schools champion as well as leading her team to the teams championship at the same tournament.

### Fraser Wilkin Wins Waikato Strokeplay

Fraser Wilkin (Auckland) claimed the biggest win of his career when he beat all comers at the Waikato Strokeplay Championship. His fellow club members Ryan Fox, Jason Mann and Mark Speedy all finished in the top 10.
