Cho and Fox Help NZ to Best Finishes

Aucklanders Cecilia Cho and Ryan Fox performed creditably at the World Teams Championships (Espirito Santos and Eisenhower Trophy) to help New Zealand to their best finishes in 20 years. And it could have been better, especially in Cecilia's case in rounds two and three of her tournament. Her rounds were going well until the final seven holes where sadly she made a few mistakes. Nevertheless, her scores counted in each round which catapulted New Zealand up the leader board from the early twenties to eventually finish 7th.

It was the men who surprised in finishing 4th overall, their best finish since winning the Eisenhower Trophy in 1994. Inclement weather reduced the Men's Tournament to 54 holes and

atrocious conditions confronted the players over the last two rounds. Ben Campbell (Masterton) was the spearhead of the men's team with his scores counting in each round. However, Ryan Fox made a great contribution to the team's finish with two of his scores counting complementing Campbell.

Overall, a great performance from our two national representatives.

Brianna Maynard Secures Champion of Champions Title

Aviation's Brianna Maynard scored the best win of her short career when she outlasted two other players at the Womens Champion of Champions Match. Tied on 156 with Pakuranga's

Munchin Keh and The Grange's Brigit Holford, Maynard held her nerve the best to win at the first play-off hole. Holford secured the runner up position by winning the second play-off hole over Keh.

The Bronze Strokeplay Championship went five extra holes before a winner was found with Cherry Reehal (Manukau) winning over Titirangi's Sue Reed after both players had tied on 190 in regulation play.

The 9 Hole Strokeplay Championship did not require extra holes. Akarana's Fiona Caldwell with a score of 99 defeated Maungakiekie's Susannah Hutchinson by two shots with defending champion Mary Cole (Titirangi) a further two shots back in third position.
